Registered Agents: Have you filled out our survey?

In accordance with NCCR 6.140, the CCB is gathering comprehensive demographic information regarding agent registration card holders. Recipients are required to complete the survey.

A survey link has been sent to all active agent card holders via email. Please complete the survey by January 21, 2021. If you've already done so, the CCB thanks you for your participation.



Register for a Metrc Live Webinar Workshop Training this month. The CCB requires all persons who actively work in Metrc must attend a Workshop Live Webinar training at least once a year. All other agent card holders who work in or manage a cannabis establishment must attend a mandatory training at least once every two years.

Private Consumption Events

The CCB issued an update to previous guidance on public consumption events to provide clarification. The CCB does not pre-approve participation in private consumption events.

However, the CCB requires information from any cannabis establishments regarding a proposed sponsorship of or participation in a private cannabis consumption event to be submitted at least 30 days prior to the event.

Coming up: Public Workshop - Jan. 19

The CCB will hold a public workshop on labeling requirements regarding cannabis and cannabis products on January 19, 2021. Interested parties will have the opportunity to submit public comment during the workshop.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Can a medical marijuana patient under 18 years of age enter a medical dispensary?

A: Minors under the age of 18 are not permitted on the premises unless the minor holds a medical letter of approval and is accompanied by a designated primary caregiver. As an alternative, many medical dispensaries offer phone and/or virtual consultations to discuss products and dosage.

Q: Where can I find a list of active licensees in the State of Nevada?

A: Currently there are 737 state-issued licenses/certificates in Nevada. A comprehensive list of those can be found on the CCB's website homepage.

Additionally, the interactive search tool on the CCB's homepage allows users to find owners, operators and board members affiliated with any license.

Q: Can retail stores/dispensaries sell gift cards?

A: Gift cards may be offered for purchase at cannabis retail stores. Please be advised a fee must be charged when the gift card is used to purchase cannabis in order to properly account for the transaction in Metrc.

Q: Can retail stores/dispensaries donate gift cards?

A: Gift cards for cannabis and/or cannabis products cannot be donated without purchase. Gift cards may be sold at a discounted price, determined by the retail cannabis store.

Gift cards which are good only for merchandise and/or non-cannabis products may be donated without purchase.
