Dear Director Klimas and Cannabis Compliance Board Members,

On behalf of Planet 13 Holdings, thank you for this opportunity to provide input on proposed changes to NCCR 5.040. We hope the following will assist the Board in drafting and applying the provisions contained therein.

The inclusion of cannabis establishment location restrictions relative to gaming in Assembly Bill 533, codified in NRS 678B.250 3.(a)(II) and effective November 23, 2019, instituted an application requirement to designate a physical location for a proposed cannabis establishment that is greater than 1,500 feet from a nonrestricted gaming license.

Retail license applications from the Nevada Department of Taxation's (DoT) September 2018 application period did not require a physical location, pursuant to DoT guidance provided to the industry during the application period. Instead, DoT required the license awardees to obtain local jurisdiction approval and final state approval to operate. Initial license awards were made on a conditional license basis until facilities became operational.

Therefore, conditional retail licenses issued in 2018 do not qualify for grandfathering from the 1,500 foot gaming setback, unless the conditional license awardee become operational and received final state approval to open prior to the November 23, 2019 effective date of AB533. A licensee who had not provided a physical location to the CCB for their conditional license (not yet opened) on or prior to November 23, 2019, cannot apply for a retail cannabis consumption lounge at that location.

Statutes enacted by the Assembly Bill 341 consumption lounge legislation further clarify the distinction regarding license status referenced above. NRS 678B.322 1.(b) states that the Board shall not issue a retail consumption lounge license unless "The adult-use cannabis retail store for which the applicant holds an adult-use cannabis establishment license is operational", referring back to the standard for location restrictions in AB533 and NRS 678B.250 3.(a)(II).

In conclusion, only retail licensees who were in operation on or prior to November 23, 2019 are qualified as being in compliance with the gaming distance setbacks enacted under AB533 and therefore eligible for a retail cannabis consumption lounge license.

For convenience, I am attaching the relevant passages of NRS 678B.250 3.(a)(II) and NRS 678B.322 1.(b) below.

NRS 678B.250(3)(a)(2)(II)

The physical address where the proposed adult-use cannabis establishment will be located and the physical address of any co-owned additional or otherwise associated adult-use cannabis establishments, the locations of which may not be on the property of an airport, within 1,000 feet of a public or private school that provides formal education traditionally associated with preschool or kindergarten through grade 12 and that existed on the date on which the application for the proposed adult-use cannabis establishment was submitted to the Board, within 300 feet of a community facility that existed on the date on which the application for the proposed adult-use cannabis establishment was submitted to the Board or, if the proposed adult-use cannabis establishment will be located in a county whose population is 100,000 or more, within 1,500 feet of an establishment that holds a nonrestricted gaming license described in subsection 1 or 2 of NRS 463.0177 and that existed on the date on which the application for the proposed adult-use cannabis establishment was submitted to the Board:

NRS 678B.322 1.(b)

- 1. The Board shall not issue an adult-use cannabis establishment license for a retail cannabis consumption lounge pursuant to NRS 678B.250 unless:
- (a) The applicant holds an adult-use cannabis establishment license for an adult-use cannabis retail store:
- (b) The adult-use cannabis retail store for which the applicant holds an adult-use cannabis establishment license is operational; and

Good morning to the Cannabis Compliance Board and staff. My name is Scot Rutledge with Argentum Partners, and I am providing comments today on behalf of Green Life Productions (GLP).

In October of 2021 CCB inspectors visited the GLP cultivation site in Pahrump, NV and began the process of investigating GLP's growing methodology. The investigation is still ongoing, and after hundreds of hours of Time & Effort billing and numerous communications between the parties, we are hopefully close to reaching the conclusion with an approved final plan of correction.

I have been honored to work with Steve and Kouanin, and their compliance consultant Sheba Statham. I am impressed with the professionalism by which they have conducted themselves and have learned a great deal about what might be the most environmentally sustainable indoor cannabis cultivation facility in North America. Steve and Kouanin are passionate about



their farming methodology, and I believe should be praised by this board and this industry for their leadership in creating a more sustainable cannabis product.

We plan to present a petition based on findings that have arisen during this process where both we and the CCB staff have agreed that new definitions and further clarification in the regulations are needed. We appreciate the hard work put in by Chief Cronkhite and her team and recognize that the methodology used at GLP's cannabis cultivation is one that requires strong evidence of scientific data and comports with not only Nevada's regulations but aligns with federal regulations as well. It is our belief that GLP's standards and processes are beyond reproach, as is evidenced by their nearly flawless pass rate in testing and the high demand for their products in the Nevada cannabis marketplace.

To the issue of Time & Effort, of which there have been several bills delivered since November of 2021 and which my client has paid on time and in good faith. We are challenged by the lack of specificity and detail provided in these bills. In a consultation with Chief Cronkhite and Deputy AG Balducci on July 12th we were promised that detailed logs would be provided in a reasonable timeframe. It has been 42 days since that request was made and we have still not received those logs. And GLP continues to receive Time & Effort bills from the CCB.



We are requesting that those logs be provided prior to another bill being sent as we are concerned that there may be erroneous billing for staff research and education on methodologies and botanical and agricultural science that we believe should not be charged to a licensee. We plan to meet with Chief Chronkite again to review these logs once we have had a chance to review them.

Thank you for your time this morning and for the hard work and dedication on behalf of your staff.

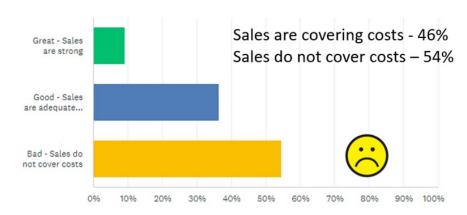

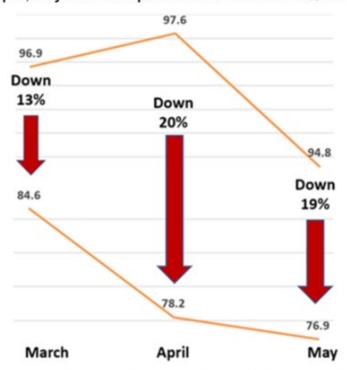
How Is Your Financial Situation?
