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CCB/DoT Release Annual Cannabis Taxable Sales Data

In a joint effort, Nevada Cannabis Compliance Board (CCB) and the Nevada Department of Taxation (DoT) released figures showing more than \$829 million in taxable sales reported by Nevada's regulated cannabis industry in FY 24. After collecting wholesale and retail excise taxes, nearly \$108 million was transferred to the State Education Fund (SEF).

During Fiscal Year 24 (July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024), licensed adult-use cannabis retail stores and medical dispensaries generated \$829,225,193 in taxable sales. This is a decrease of roughly 2% as compared to over \$848,145,356 in taxable sales from FY 23.

NRS 372A.290 directs all revenue from the 10-percent State Retail Cannabis Excise Tax into the State Education Fund (SEF), formerly the Distributive School Account (DSA).

The State Wholesale Cannabis Excise Tax revenue collected is transferred to the CCB and used to support the regulatory oversight of the cannabis industry in Nevada. The CCB also distributes a total amount of \$5 million of the revenue collected from wholesale excise tax to local governments to carry out the provisions of NRS 678 C&D. The remaining unused State Wholesale Cannabis Excise Tax revenue is transferred to the SEF by the CCB along with civil penalties, licensing and other fees collected through regulation of the cannabis industry.
