CANNABIS COMPLIANCE BOARD STATE OF NEVADA



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After requesting and implementing feedback from industry, the Nevada Cannabis Compliance Board is issuing clarifying guidance due to industry confusion and inconsistent practices regarding cannabis tincture testing. Traditional tinctures are intended for sublingual or mucosal absorption. Any other type of "tincture" must be tested as other products with the same intended route of administration.

How are tinctures tested?

Testing is determined by the route of administration:

- Tincture intended for topical application is tested as a topical.
- Tincture intended for oral ingestion is tested as an edible.
 - o Full homogeneity testing panels are required for edibles.
- Tincture intended for sublingual or mucosal absorption is tested as a concentrate.
 - o If this tincture was already tested as a concentrate in an intermediate step, then the tincture is tested as an infused non-edible.
- The production facility is responsible for selecting the correct testing category in Metrc as described above to ensure that the required tests are performed by the testing laboratory.
