CCB/Tax Release Annual Cannabis Taxable Sales Data

In a joint effort, the Nevada Cannabis Compliance Board (CCB) and the Nevada Department of Taxation released figures showing **nearly \$758 million in taxable sales reported by Nevada's regulated cannabis industry in Fiscal Year 25**. After collecting wholesale and retail excise taxes, **nearly \$96 million was transferred to the State Education Fund (SEF)**.

During FY 25 (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025) licensed adult-use cannabis retail stores and medical dispensaries generated \$757,714,911 in taxable sales. This is a decrease of roughly 8.6% as compared to \$829,225,193 in taxable sales from FY 24.

NRS 372A.290 directs all revenue from the 10-percent State Retail Cannabis Excise Tax into the State Education Fund (SEF), formerly the Distributive School Account (DSA).

The State Wholesale Cannabis Excise Tax revenue collected is transferred to the CCB and used to support the regulatory oversight of the cannabis industry in Nevada. The CCB also distributes a total amount of \$5 million of the revenue collected from wholesale excise tax to local governments to carry out the provisions of NRS 678 C&D. The remaining unused State Wholesale Cannabis Excise Tax revenue is transferred to the SEF by the CCB along with licensing and other fees collected through regulation of the cannabis industry.
