

Nevada Cannabis Compliance Board

Meeting Minutes May 21, 2026

The Nevada Cannabis Compliance Board (CCB) held a public meeting at 9:00 a.m. on May 21, 2026 at the Nevada Legislative Counsel Bureau 7120 Amigo Street, Room 5, Las Vegas, Nevada and at the Nevada Legislative Counsel Bureau 401 S. Carson Street, Room 2134, Carson City, Nevada.

Chair Berry called the meeting to order.

Executive Director Michael Miles called the roll, and a quorum was established.

Chair Berry was present in Carson City; Members Durrett, Mazzorana and Rath were present in Las Vegas. Member Merritt was not present.

Chair Berry removed Agenda Item IV A from the discussion and opened Agenda Item I.

I. Public Comment

Steve Owens, of Oracle Corporation, said Oracle Corporation is now in the cannabis market and summarized they have a regulatory ecosystem which includes automated licensing, embedded compliance and enforcement, case management and embedded AI. He expressed interest in discussing seed-to-sale, track-and-trace and future possibilities of the CCB and Oracle's regulatory, integrated platform.

Tom Elgus spoke regarding a complaint he submitted and explained that he made a purchase from a company in Las Vegas, and expressed concern that the labeling did not contain warnings for residual solvents existing in the product. He noted there are medical benefits to using cannabis, but the package label should include warnings that these solvents can cause serious side effects to the user. Additionally, Mr. Elgus stated his belief that if a complaint is filed, the complainant should receive a summary of the outcome of the complaint and investigation.

There were no additional public comments.

Chair Berry noted a written public comment was received via email from Dan and that it will be introduced into public comment.

II. Consent Agenda

A. Consideration of Approval of April 16, 2026, Cannabis Compliance Board Meeting Minutes

B. Consideration of Approval to Extend Final Inspection Deadline to May 15, 2027, Nevada Consumption Lounge LLC (CLI009)

Chair Berry opened Agenda Item II for discussion. There was no discussion.

Chair Berry moved to approve the Consent Agenda.

Members Durrett, Mazzorana, Rath said aye. Motion carried.

III. **Approvals and Resolutions**

A. Notice of Final Licensure : NevCann LLC (C056)

Steve Gilbert, Chief of Licensing and Administration advised the board that final license was issued to NevCann LLC. A conditional, adult-use license was granted during the June 2018 application period held by the Nevada Department of Taxation and awarded in the City of Las Vegas jurisdiction. The Cannabis Compliance Board conducted a pre-opening inspection and audit in January 2026, and in April 2026, CCB staff issued notice that all regulatory requirements were met and the licensee can become operational. Final Licensure was issued to NevCann LLC for its adult-use cultivation facility on April 15, 2026.

Chair Berry asked for comments or discussion. There were none.

IV. **Complaints**

A. Approval to Proceed with Disciplinary Action – Respondent A

Executive Director Michael Miles stated the Attorney General conducted investigation of suspected regulatory violations as required by [Nevada Revised Statutes 678A.510](#) and recommended proceeding with disciplinary action. Mr. Miles noted the board had the opportunity to review a drafted, proposed complaint. Additionally, the proposed complaint does not contain the name or license number of the respondent which ensures that it does not violate the right of the person charged in the complaint to due process in any later hearing.

Mr. Miles reminded that board that NRS 678A.510 requires the board to make one of three possible determinations regarding a proposed disciplinary action:

1. Decline to proceed with disciplinary action
2. Authorize the Attorney General to enter settlement negotiations to resolve the violations
3. Proceed with the disciplinary action

Mr. Miles summarized the proposed complaint and types of violations.

Chair Berry opened the matter for discussion. There was no discussion.

Chair Berry moved to authorize the Executive Director and the office of the Nevada Attorney General to serve the complaint and proceed with disciplinary action against Respondent A.

Member Rath seconded. Members Durrett and Mazzorana said aye. Motion carried.

V. **Transfers of Interest**

Rachel Branner, Division Chief – Investigation and Enforcement, presented one transfer of interest.

A. **Libra Wellness Center, LLC (C149, P094) (TOI #25000007)** selling ownership of C149 and P094 to Wellness Growth Capital LLC, NRHCJ LLC

Item VA was removed from the agenda

B. **Waveseer LLC; Waveseer of Las Vegas, LLC (D132) (TOI #2500011)** selling one hundred percent (100%) ownership of D132 to Natural Medicine LLC (ACON-A22-00038, C052, P039, D089, D091, D145, T077)

Chief Branner said Waveseer LLC requests approval to sell its dispensary license (D132) to Natural Medicine LLC, an existing cannabis licensee, on behalf of its subsidiary, Waveseer of Las Vegas, LLC. If approved, Waveseer of Las Vegas will retain its cultivation and production licenses, and the dispensary license will be conveyed to Natural Medicine. With this transaction, Natural Medicine will own a total of four dispensaries in Southern Nevada. Waveseer and Natural Medicine each requested waiver of NCCR 5.110 pursuant to NCCR 5.112. No areas of concern were identified. Ms. Branner introduced Alicia Ashcraft, David Rosen, CEO and Manager of Waveseer of Las Vegas, and from Natural Medicine: Donald Forman, majority owner, and Lindsay Klimitz, Director of Operations to the board.

Alicia Ashcraft, representing Waveseer greeted the board.

Jacqueline Vokoun of Bendavid Law appeared on behalf of the buyer, Natural Medicine and introduced Elle Naitoh, Director of Compliance. Ms. Vokoun thanked the CCB Investigation team, specifically Michael Covington, for his work getting the transfer approved.

Chair Berry asked for comments; there were none.

Chair Berry moved to approve Agenda Item VB, Waveseer LLC; Waveseer of Las Vegas, LLC (D132) (TOI #2500011), allowing the transfer of entity number D132 to Natural Medicine LLC and to approve a waiver of the requirements of NCCR 5.110 for Waveseer and Natural Medicine for any transfer of less than 5% subject to the condition the waiver expires on the next agenda date. Member Rath seconded. All Members said aye. Motion carried.

Ms. Ashcraft thanked Chair Berry for the approval and thanked and acknowledged Michael Covington. She expressed sadness this is the last item she will work with him on and said he was a joy to work with and always had a smile on his face. Ms. Ashcraft said he will be greatly missed.

VI. Briefing from the Chair and Executive Director

Chair Berry agreed with comments made by Ms. Ashcraft and acknowledged it is difficult to lose a colleague, especially a well-respected and well-liked colleague. He expressed condolences to Mr. Covington's family and to members of CCB and said the board is supportive and appreciative of his work.

Chair Berry said the CCB will schedule board meetings once every other month beginning in June 2026 and acknowledged meetings are streamlined because of the great work the staff does every day, but meetings may not always be short.

Executive Director Miles thanked Chair Berry and restated the next board meeting will occur in June and there may be discussion on regulations during that meeting. R152-24 will be presented for vote in June, and the board meeting schedule will be revisited in December.

Mr. Miles introduced Senior Deputy Attorney General Allison Herr.

Ms. Herr announced that Senior Deputy Attorney General Anthony Garasi is no longer working at the office of the Attorney General and accepted a position with an organization that supports Nevada's charter schools. Ms. Herr expressed appreciation for his professionalism, steady judgment and humor and wished him and his family the very best.

Mr. Miles announced additional personnel changes: Mr. Miles is officially the Executive Director of the Cannabis Compliance Board. Steve Gilbert is now Deputy Director, accepting the position on May 18, 2026. Amber Powell is departing the CCB.

Additionally, Mr. Miles addressed federal marijuana rescheduling announced by the Department of Justice on April 28, 2026. He acknowledged this announcement created questions for Nevada licensees, patients and members of the public. Mr. Miles stressed that Nevada law has not changed and CCB's licensing, compliance and enforcement responsibilities remain in place. Nevada cannabis establishments are expected to continue following Nevada law and CCB regulations. There are unanswered questions regarding federal framework and federal agencies and courts are working through legal and operational issues.

Importantly, Nevada's dual license structure under [NRS 678D.490](#) is different from the system used in other states and CCB is waiting for additional federal guidance. The board is unable to provide answers on how individual licenses may be treated under federal law. He stated CCB's goal is to provide accurate information, maintain stability in Nevada's regulated cannabis industry and to continue carrying out board responsibilities under Nevada law. The board will provide updates to licensees and to the public as it becomes available.

VIII. Items for Future Agendas

Member Rath requested a report be provided by CCB staff to the board for discussion only for the August 2026 meeting with the status of licensees who received five or more extensions for final inspection under current ownerships, except for licensees in moratorium jurisdictions.

Member Rath expressed condolences to Mr. Covington's family remembering that he worked with him at the office of the Attorney General and that he was very friendly and easy to work with. Finally, he congratulated Mr. Miles and Mr. Gilbert on their new positions.

Member Durrett congratulated Mr. Miles and Mr. Gilbert.

IX. Public Comment

Tom Elgus addressed the board and said his concerns were addressed by CCB staff and he understood the tests are done but details are not provided. He suggested that testing details should be provided on labels and restated that when a complaint is made, the complainant should be advised of an outcome.

There was no additional public comment.

X. Adjournment

Meeting adjourned at 9:28 a.m.
